

But the waiting, the fearful, agonized, hopeless waiting in the dark and bitter cold may have cost many of them their reason.

One of the things that carries out this belief is that the Carpathia did not wait to pick up any possible survivors clinging to bouys, but steamed directly toward New York.

The Carpathia has only one doctor on board. Probably the majority of the 866 survivors she picked up are in the most urgent need of medical attention.

The Olympic, sister ship of the Titanic, still is cruising about the scene of the disaster, in the faint hope that some may yet be saved, and is acting as a relay wireless to this point.
