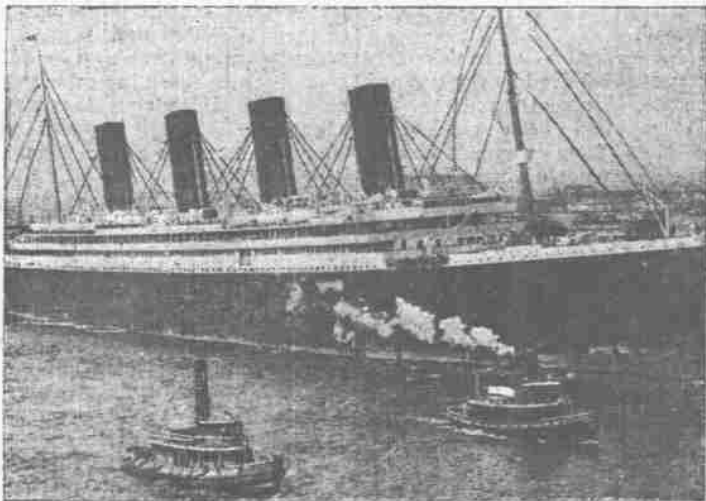

## 1,492 GO DOWN TO THEIR DEATH IN LOSS OF "WORLD'S GREATEST LINER"

*Women and Children Saved; Men Stay To Die; Pitiful  
Scenes as News Is Awaited; World's Most Noted  
Names Among "Missing."*



This late photograph is a good likeness of the steamer Titanic, largest of the world's great liners, as she appeared before her thrilling crash with a submerged iceberg at sea.

New York, April 16.—It is now practically certain that 1,492 human beings went to their death in the loss of the giant Titanic on the ice banks of Newfoundland.

The last hope that any but the

866 passengers picked up by the Cunarder Carpathia, now bound for this city, had been rescued, went glimmering at noon today.

Up to that time, relatives and officials of the White Star line
