BIG PLANT FOR DURHAM

Cigarette Manufacturing Concern Will Be Moved from New York.

Durham, N. C., April 15.—News has been received here that the American Tobacco Company will move its Sovereign Cigarette manufacturing plant to Durham, and will probably install it in the old British-American stemmy building. The plant at first will have 400 or 500 employees, and these will be increased from time to time until the number will reach 1,000 or more.

The Sovereign Cigarette plant is one of the largest in existence, and has an annual output of millions of dollars worth of goods. The monthly payroll runs way up in the thousands, and the acquisition of the Sovereign cigarette manufacturing concern by Durham will mean more than anything that has come to the city in a long time. The plant is now located in the Thirtieth District of New York.

RICHMOND PEOPLE IN TITANIC WRECK

Robert W. Daniel Was Passenger—Jacques Futrelle, Author, Once Lived Here.

One of the passengers on the ill-fated Titanic was Robert Williams Daniel, of Philadelphia, a son of Mrs. J. R. V. Daniel, who resides in the Chesterfield Apartments.

Mr. and Mrs. Jacques Futrelle were also on the passenger list. Mr. Futrelle, who has become an author of note, formerly lived in Richmond, and was a reporter for the Richmond Times. Mrs. Futrelle has appeared on the stage of the Bijou Theatre.

Mrs. Bradley Johnston, of Gloucester county, had booked a passage on the monster ship Titanic for her return trip to Europe next week. She is a sister-in-law of Dr. George Ben Johnston, of Richmond.

The wreck of the Titanic is not the first horror through which Mr. Daniel has passed. During the Carlton Hotel fire in London last year, he displayed conspicuous bravery in saving the life of an English banker named Batsholtz. The latter was overcome with smoke, and Mr. Daniel carried him to a window.

Here they remained for half an hour, before a rope was lowered from the roof. To the rope Mr. Daniel tied the unconscious banker, who was thus lowered to the ground. Mr. Daniel was hoisted by the head and smoke, but began the descent. He was pulled in a window near the ground by firemen.

Mrs. Daniel was unable last night to get any word as to her son's safety. Mr. Futrelle, a native Georgian, had done a great amount of newspaper work. This has been varied with theatrical management. In 1904 he became identified with the editorial department of the Boston American, remaining there for two years. He is the author of short stories, which have brought him fame and fortune, dealing largely with semi-mystic subjects.

DESCRIPTION OF LINER TITANIC

The following description of the Titanic was sent out by the White Star Line, and was intended for use in connection with the story of that vessel's expected arrival in New York to-day.

Larger even than the glittens Olympic, the new White Star Line leviathan Titanic began her maiden trip under the most auspicious circumstances.

Many wonderful innovations have been made part of this newest of transatlantic wonders. The Titanic's 66,000 tons of displacement and 16,238 tons gross register are not her sole claim to distinction as the most elaborate handiwork of the shipwrights. The Titanic is the first steamer to be built with private promenades in connection with some of her splendid suites. Heretofore the newest and greatest ocean lines have been, in fact, floating apartment hotels, but it falls to the Titanic to provide the transatlantic traveler with an actual private residence, even to the exclusive promenade deck, without encroaching upon the space of the other hundreds of first-cabin voyagers.

The Titanic, like its sister ship, the Olympic, possesses the great length of 882 feet, six inches, and a beam of 92 feet, six inches, and a over the bow, the Titanic's beam spans ninety-four feet even. Four great funnels rise eighty-one and half feet above the uppermost deck with a total distance of 175 feet from the top of the funnels to the keel.

Fifteen watertight bulkheads divide the great vessel, MAKING HER UNSINKABLE, even though half of her compartments should be filled with water. Eleven steel decks add to the Titanic's staunchness while an idea of the vast promenade space may best be had when it is noted that the main promenade deck alone has an

unbroken sweep of 190 yards on either side of the ship.

A Parisian cafe and palm room are but some of the features of this remarkable vessel which will now enter regularly in the Plymouth-Cheerbourg-Southampton-New York service with the Olympic.

has a seating capacity for nearly 500 passengers, there is an a la carte restaurant, French service, which seats 200 passengers. The restaurant features will be especially appreciated by those who do not desire to be held to regular hours for dining, for night suppers, dinner parties, etc.

The size of the state rooms is also one of the remarkable features of the new glittens Titanic. Varying from eight feet to nine feet, six inches in height, they are all roomy. Some of the two-berth cabins are seventeen by ten feet six inches, in size. There are no four-berth rooms, and a great number of single-berth rooms, eight and half by ten and half feet, have been provided.

A great swimming pool, squash racket court, gymnasium and the Turkish baths are all close together on a lower deck, from which elevators carry the passengers to the various upper decks.

As in her sister ship, the Olympic, passengers on the Titanic will descend the grand staircase to the main reception room, which, in turn, leads into the great dining saloon, from which it is separated by glass.

Stretching the full width of the vessel amidships, the main dining saloon is light and cheerful, and at night, with its myriads of electric lights, it presents a veritable fairyland.

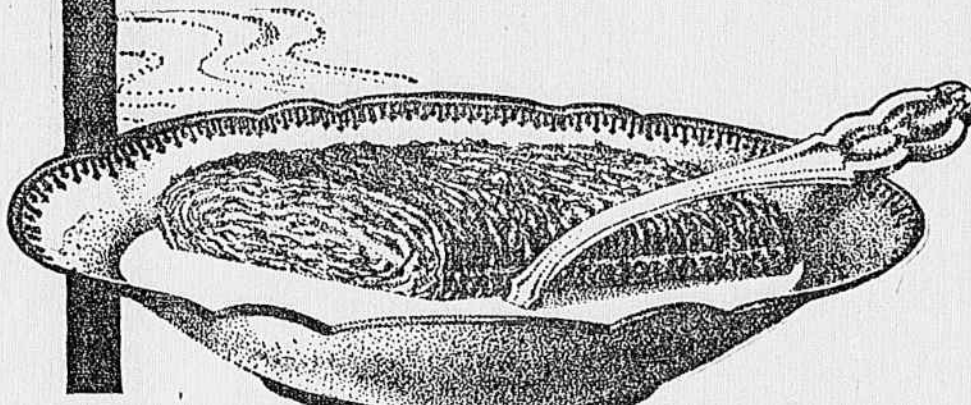
