Single members of Lloyds of London who took risks too large for them to bear may have to suffer, but in the general run the risks have been very widely distributed."

Nearly every large marine underwriter in New York is cald to have carried a full line of insurance on the Titanic's cargo, the value of which is problematical.

It is generally predicted that the rate on marine insurance risks will be mate-rially advanced on account of the Ti-tanic's experience.


